What we do

Our mission

Our mission is to address the challenges of isolation and exclusion experienced by children and young people with additional needs and disabilities.

Our vision

To champion the right for inclusion for all children and young people with additional needs and disabilities across Berkshire, through our partnerships with families, volunteers, activity leaders and other voluntary and statutory sector organisations.

"It's very easy to take the Me2 Club for granted. Now my daughter has accessed the Me2 for nearly 10 years it's hard to remember life before. Going to Guides with a Me2 helper has allowed M to attend a mainstream activity that if she hasn't had the support she wouldn't have been able to. What we offer

Me2 Club is an inclusion charity for children and young people with additional needs and disabilities in the Wokingham and Reading Boroughs. We offer a variety of different activities to increase children and young people's confidence and independence as well as helping them make new friends.

We support children and young people aged 5-19 to take part in mainstream leisure activities by recruiting and training volunteers to 'buddy' 1:1 with them (2:1 when required) so they can join in and have fun. With our help they can access a wide range of activities including sports clubs, uniformed groups and drama classes. We do not require a formal diagnosis to offer support.

We also run a youth participation programme for young people which includes TeenW&Rd monthly teen group, "Say YES" and "Special United" SEND youth forums, and our Young Mental Health Champions.



Who we help


Our Core Service and Participation groups supported 198 children and young people over the past year. Some of the children and young people accessed more than one of these services with 124 being part of the core service and 74 accessing the participation groups.




We are proud to support children, families and volunteers from a wide variety of backgrounds. The majority of the children accessing our support were aged between 5 and 12, a key stage in life when mainstream activities offer valuable opportunities to socialise, build confidence, and develop new skills. We supported more young people between 13-20 due to our increased participation offer.

We saw a slight increase from 39.5 to 41% of females being supported this year.

The majority of the children and young people we support across all of our services are neurodivergent. The chart shows the children's main additional need but many of the children have multiple other needs in addition to the need shown here.

We do not require a diagnosis for our support as we know how difficult it can be to gain a diagnosis and we do not want this to be a barrier for children and young people to access our services.



Who we help

Ethnicities

This year we continued to welcome children and young people from a wide variety of backgrounds into all our services. The majority of these are from white backgrounds, which correlates with the local populations of Wokingham and Reading. We are pleased to have reached so many other communities and hope to expand our reach in under-represented communities in the coming financial year. The majority (64%) of children accessing our services live in Wokingham but this year has seen an increase in children and young people being supported from Reading from 22% to 35%.






Core Service Impact

Our core service is designed to open up opportunities for children to take part in activities they might otherwise miss out on. Beyond participation, we focus on building each child's confidence, encouraging greater independence, and helping to reduce feelings of social isolation. For some children, the long-term goal is to gain enough confidence and skills to attend these activities without volunteer support. We're proud to share that this year, 7 children reached that milestone and are now taking part independently.

Every family we supported this year said they would recommend Me2 Club to others, a powerful reflection of the impact we're making. Many shared heartfelt feedback about the difference the service has made, with several highlighting that, without Me2 Club, their child simply wouldn't have the opportunity to take part in mainstream activities.

Our Core Service supports children with additional needs at activities around Wokingham and Reading. This service enables children to attend uniform groups, swimming lessons, drama

classes, sports clubs and martial arts. Each child is matched

with a carefully selected, trained volunteer who attend with them each week to provide the individual support each child needs.

This year we have supported 124 children and young people with 87 from Wokingham and 37 from Reading.

Core Service Impact on Confidence



With the dedicated support of our volunteers, children are empowered to believe in themselves and explore what they're capable of achieving. This positive impact is echoed in the feedback we received from both volunteers and parents.

An incredible 95.3% of parents and carers observed a boost in their child's confidence, with 77% rating that change as a 4 or 5, highlighting a meaningful and lasting difference in how their children see themselves and engage with the world around them.

Core Service Impact on Independence



When families first join our service, many parents and carers attend activities alongside their children, as it's often the only way they can take part. With the support of a Me2 Club volunteer, children begin to attend more independently, taking part without a parent present. Over time, many children grow in confidence and need less support from their volunteer.

Parents frequently tell us that this growing independence doesn't just benefit their child at Me2 Club activities, it often encourages them to try new clubs and experiences beyond our service. This year, 95.5% of parent carers reported an increase in their child's independence, showing a significant step forward in their personal development.

Core Service Impact on Social Isolation



Children with additional needs and disabilities often face social isolation, as joining in with leisure activities can be challenging due to barriers like accessibility, lack of understanding, or difficulties with social interaction.

With the consistent support of a trusted volunteer, children are able to take part more regularly, feel more at ease, and begin to build meaningful connections. Our service helps create inclusive opportunities where children can make local friends, engage with a wider peer group, and enjoy activities they might not otherwise be able to access.

"Me2 allows A to build relationships with other children outside of the school classroom. Without it, the sorts of confidence building experiences that other children take for granted would simply not be available to him. It's also the wealth of experience in the organisation as well, that allows us to support A in other areas of his life. Seeing what he's capable of when he has more independence has helped us work with his teachers at school."

75% of parents and carers reported that their child increased in sociability and connectedness. For many of the children we support, who often experience significant social isolation before joining Me2 Club, this represents a powerful and positive shift in their ability to build relationships and feel part of a community.



Hear from our Children

Hearing directly from the children about their experiences with Me2 Club is incredibly important to us. We invited feedback from those who had been matched with their volunteer for over a term, and we were delighted by the positive responses they shared about both the charity and their volunteers.

77% rated their enjoyment of their activity with their volunteer as 5/5

We're proud that 100% of our exiting core service volunteers rated their experience as 'good' or 'excellent.' Just as importantly, all of them used their volunteering experience to support applications for employment or further study. We're thrilled that being part of Me2 Club has helped them take meaningful steps towards their career or education goals.

This year, our incredible volunteers gave a total of 4466 hours of their time across all areas of Me2 Club, from our core service and participation activities to fundraising events and trustee roles. Of that, 3,668 hours were dedicated specifically to supporting children at their weekly mainstream activities, providing vital respite to families.

In total, 170 volunteers contributed to our work, including 154 who were directly involved in our core service. Their support enabled children to access and enjoy a wide range of activities that might otherwise be out of reach.

Volunteer Induction Training

Last financial year, we welcomed and trained 62 new volunteers across six training sessions held in April, June, August, twice in November, and February. Each session is carefully designed to equip our volunteers with the skills and confidence they need to support children and young people with additional needs and disabilities.

Our comprehensive training programme includes sections on understanding additional needs, effective communication, behaviour support, safeguarding, manual handling, and clearly defining volunteers' roles and responsibilities. We continually review and enhance our training to ensure it meets the evolving needs of the children we support and the volunteers who play such a vital role in their lives. We are incredibly proud that so many of our volunteers describe the training as both empowering and impactful:

- 99% of volunteers trained increased their knowledge of additional needs after attending Volunteer Induction Training increasing their ratings of their knowledge from an average 5.2/10 to 8.9/10.
- 85% felt more ready to be matched after completing training, improving their ratings of confidence in being matched from an average 6.5/10 to 8.5/10 after training
- 99% of volunteers rated their experience of training as 'Good', 'Very Good' or 'Excellent'
- 100% of volunteers felt that the training met the objectives


Our Volunteer Demographics


The majority of our volunteers are aged 16–18, which is often a great match for the children we support, many of whom benefit from having a peer-like volunteer by their side. Our young volunteers bring energy, empathy, and relatability, helping children feel more comfortable and confident when taking part in activities.

Because the children and young people we support have a wide range of needs, it's vital that our volunteer team reflects diversity in age, experience, and background. This helps us carefully match each child with a volunteer who suits their individual personality and support requirements.

We're also proud to report increased gender diversity this year. While the majority of our volunteers continue to be female (109 out of 154), we welcomed a growing number of male volunteers, rising from 30 to 45. Many of these new male volunteers are aged 16–18 and have made a meaningful impact, particularly with children who feel more comfortable being supported by a male role model during activities like swimming or sports clubs.

Meet James and Michael

James was initially matched with a Me2 Club volunteer in 2017 when he was 8 years old. He was attending Cubs and found it difficult to join in with the group due to anxiety and struggling to understand some of the instructions. Over the years he has been supported by three different volunteers and has built positive relationships with each of them.

In 2021, James was matched with Michael at his Scouts group. Michael continued supporting him as he progressed to Explorers, and over the past four years, the two have built a fantastic bond. With Michael by his side, James's confidence has grown enormously. He's built friendships in the group and now joins in with all the activities, reassured by the knowledge that Michael is there if he needs support. James feels that the support Michael offers has helped him to 'consistently engage with Scouts'.

James has made incredible progress and is now a Young Leader at Explorers, where he helps run activities for the rest of the group. He's also taken part in Me2 Club's Volunteer Training sessions, sharing his experiences to help new volunteers understand the difference their support can make. His growing confidence has even led him to travel abroad with his Scout and Explorer groups, visiting Japan, Africa, and Switzerland.



Our Reading SEND Youth Forum

Special United has been going for 8 years. Me2 Club took over running the forum, with funding from Brighter Futures for Children, in September 2024. In the remaining 6 months of the financial year, we have helped young people have a say in:

- The PINS pilot project (Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools
- Content of the Local Offer
- Spoken to the Director of Education
- · A new neurodiversity strengths and needs tool
- The redesign of CAMHS services and
- Contributed to the national Case for Change in Neurodiversity.

Young Mental Health Champions - Include Me2

Back in January 2024, Me2 Club were successful in getting funding from the organisations below to enable our young people to become Mental Health Champions. The group has gone really well and we were pleased to get funding for another 9 months, taking us to November 2025! We were also chosen to feature in an SNG video promoting their work!

In the last year, our young people:

- Completed their training with the Reading Mental Health Support Team
- Attended the Parallel Windsor Inclusion Festival, taking artwork they had created.
- Designed a video on the NHS 5 Steps to Wellbeing, which they then starred in!
- Attended the Wokingham Borough Council Children's Scrutiny Committee & Wokingham's SEND Strategy Board
- Advised Reading's Mental Health Support team on accessible leaflets and website information.
- Produced an accessibility guide for written information and commented on the draft hospital Neurodiversity Passport.
- Attended the Reading Borough Council Adult, Children and Education committee.
- Met with our patron Ayo Sokale for a fantastic, inspiring talk on mental health.

TeenW&Rd - our Teen Club

Our teens have met monthly over a takeaway. They choose trips to go on and how they will fundraise for these trips - resolving any disagreements themselves.

In the last year we have done a second Young Driver's experience, had a trip to a local ice cream parlour, held a talent show to raise money for the trips (and baked delicious cakes to sell beforehand), taken part in a charity football match with KPMG, been on a festive steam train trip and ran the Green Park Challenge, which raised over £1000!!

Our over 13s Christmas party was attended by 25 young people (10 of whom were from our other Me2 groups).

Me2 Club are committed to coproduction (doing with our young people rather than to them) as well as enabling them to develop their confidence and independence. As well as our core service and groups, we are always looking for ways to involve our young people in the running of our charity.

Five young people took part in our annual Takeover Day in April 2024, meeting

our CEO, taking over our social media and more!

In May 2024, three of our young people also helped us with interviewing for our new Fundraising Manager.

We also ran the first of what we would like to be an annual survey of young people with additional needs across Reading and Wokingham. 70 young people take part from a diverse range of backgrounds and education settings.

Young people also had the opportunity to attend an accessible session at the Winter Wonderland in Hyde Park and attend residential weekends with Phab, a charity that we are a member of to give young people a range of exiting opportunities.





Family events

In 2024, Me2 Club hosted three inclusive family events designed to bring children, young people, and their families together in a safe, welcoming space where everyone feels valued and understood. These events offered opportunities for families to relax, have fun, and connect with others in an environment that celebrates inclusion.

Our Easter Party in April was a joyful afternoon filled with hands-on activities such as planting, biscuit decorating, and card making. The celebration ended with a special visit from the Easter Bunny, who delighted everyone by handing out Easter eggs.

We hosted our Summer Party at TVAP, where children enjoyed the chance to cool off in the splash area and take part in a variety of fun activities.

Our Family Christmas Party brought festive cheer, featuring a special visit from Santa who delivered gifts to all our children, young people, and their siblings, made possible thanks to the incredible generosity of our supporters.

A huge thank you to our wonderful volunteers, supporters, and trustees who made the family events possible through their time and dedication.



In addition to our family events, we enabled 15 families to attend Sporting Bears Dream Rides event. The children, parents and sibling got to ride in a variety of sports, rally and super cars.


Our Income & Expenditure


